COVID-19—Telehealth, Outreach, Safety



Maumee Valley Guidance Center has remained open and available to clients and our community throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. As Ohio begins to take steps forward in re-opening, we will continue to be here providing services through the “Stay Safe Ohio” order. We continue to offer telehealth appointments through video or phone, allowing clients to stay at home while keeping their appointments. Our offices are following all safety guidelines, including social distancing and cleaning standards. Our staff are wearing masks, and any clients entering our buildings will also be provided with masks to wear. We encourage people to comply with the new “Stay Safe Ohio Order” while actively participating in treatment and taking care of their mental health.

Our prevention department has also been providing community supports during this time through flyers and social media. Information about local and national resources, including crisis hotlines, as well as signs of distress and self-care tips have been distributed through print and email for our community members. The Napoleon location offers ease of access, a bright, airy waiting area, therapy offices, case management offices and a conference room. The Napoleon staff has met the challenges of the current societal restrictions, maintained compliance with CDC guidelines and continues to offer quality services to the community. Services offered at Napoleon include outpatient and home-based therapy (individual, family, children, couples), group therapy, case management services (youth and adult), school-based therapy, Tele-med services, and offers clients access to the SSVF and all other MVGC programs. May—Mental Health Awareness Month

ACCESS to Care: Our Commitment

Access to services is one measure that contracting entities require of agencies providing mental health services. The ability for a client to call and schedule an appointment quickly is important not only to the client, but also to Maumee Valley Guidance Center. At MVGC, we understand that once a client reaches out, the length of time between initial call and the first appointment with their mental health provider helps to determine the course of client treatment. We are proud to be able to get clients in to see a Masters level Clinician within 3.2 days, on average, of their initial call for their assessment. After the initial assessment, clients then have an appointment scheduled to begin treatment with their provider within an average of 2 days. MVGC is committed to providing quick access to quality care for all of our clients.

Prevention—Incredible Years/Dino School



The Incredible Years®, also known as Dino School, is an evidence-based program that helps reduce challenging behaviors in children and increase their social emotional learning and self-control skills. The Incredible Years® program use dinosaur-themed materials and life-size puppets, Wally and Dina, to engage children and build social and emotional skills. The curriculum emphasizes skills such as emotional literacy, empathy, friendship skills, managing emotions, and problem-solving. Each week, a topic is introduced to help students learn and strengthen these important skills. These topics include listening, identifying feelings, controlling anger, friendships, bullying/teasing, telling the truth, sharing, helping and manners. Each week, students engage in interactive activities to help enhance the lesson and participate in a compliment circle to help build self-esteem. An activity sheet is also given to the children to complete at home with an adult to help bring the lessons and skills home. The program is offered to all Pre-K through 1st grade classes in the four-county area, as well as in preschools/day care centers, and libraries. During the recent 2019-2020 school year, over 1900 students from the four-county area participated in the program.
