Signs of Suicide

The SOS Signs of Suicide Prevention Program (SOS) is a universal, school-based depression awareness and suicide prevention program offered to all middle and high schools in the four county area.

5 Goals

- 1) Decrease suicide and suicide attempts by increasing student knowledge and adaptive attitudes about depression.
- 2) Encourage personal help-seeking and/or help-seeking on behalf of a friend.
- 3) Reduce the stigma of mental illness and acknowledge the importance of seeking help or treatment.
- 4) Engage parents and school staff as partners in prevention through "gatekeeper" education.
- 5) Encourage schools to develop community-based partnerships to support student mental health.

Signs of Suicide is included in the National Registry of Evidence-Based Programs and Practices (NREPP).



Why Have School-Based Programs?

"School and community prevention programs designed to address suicide and suicidal behavior as part of a broader focus on mental health, coping skills in response to stress, substance abuse, aggressive behaviors, are most likely to be successful in the long run."

The Incredible Years® is an evidence-based program that helps reduce challenging behaviors in children and increase their social emotional learning and self-control skills.

The Incredible Years® child training programs use dinosaur-themed materials and life-size puppets to engage children and strengthen social, emotional, and academic skills. The program is offered to all Pre-K through 1st grade classes in the four county area.

The Dinosaur Curriculum emphasizes training children in skills such as: emotional literacy, empathy or perspective taking, friendship skills, anger management, interpersonal problem-solving, school rules and how to be successful at school.
